

Oklahoma City Sign Ordinance #19990

Ordinance #19990, approved by Council on July 20, 1993, authorizes the placement of neighborhood signs on existing street sign posts subject to the Chief Traffic Engineer's approval. The following are some guidelines for contacting the Chief Traffic Engineer for approval:

1. A neighborhood representative must write a letter to the City Traffic Engineer, requesting authorization for placement of a neighborhood sign on an existing sign post. The letter must include the following information:
 - type of sign(s) to be placed.
 - a map showing the request location(s).
2. No neighborhood sign will be approved for placement on a regulatory sign post. For example: Stop, Yield, Speed Limit, Parking, etc.
3. The Traffic Engineer will respond to the letter noting the approved location(s) and any locations that are not acceptable.
4. Once the locations have been approved, then the neighborhood can obtain and install their signs.
