City of Oklahoma City Sidewalk Repair and Replacement Program

OKC's Sidewalk Repair and Replacement Program helps residential property owners improve their neighborhood's walkability. If you are responsible for the sidewalk on a residential property you own, the City can split the cost of repairing or replacing it. The City will provide labor, equipment and materials for sidewalk construction if your sidewalk is selected for the program.

You may be eligible if:

- You own a residential property in OKC limits.
- You can provide half the project cost before construction begins.
- The property is fully improved and occupied.
- The sidewalk is your responsibility, and not the homeowner's association or someone else.
- The sidewalk is in a platted easement.

Eligible damage includes:


- Settlement and/or buckling of at least 1 inch.
- Horizontal cracks of at least 1.5 inches.
- A deteriorating or missing panel creating a hazard.

A word from one of our Police Community Relations Officers:

MSgt. Michael Loruse, Will Rogers Division PCR Only Leave In Your Car What You Don't Mind Being Stolen

Years ago, when my son was in junior high school, he told me while in study hall he pulled out a dollar bill and noticed a group of "troubled looking kids" at another table all turn their heads toward him and stare at his dollar bill, like a dog going to point. My son said he wondered what would happen if he put the dollar bill in his book partially exposed. So he did just that and then requested for the teacher to let him go to the restroom. He put his experiment into action. When he returned from the restroom he saw his book on the floor near where he was sitting and his dollar bill missing. He told me he looked at the table of kids who were birddogging his money and they were all looking away not making eye contact with him. I asked my son what he learned from this incident. He said, "I learned to be more careful with all my money."

This lesson about protecting your property seems so simple but, sadly, we read police auto burglary reports which reflect stolen property taken from the vehicles that were in plain view. Items such as cash money, car and house keys, wallets, laptop computers, guns and, one that surprised me, a new huge flat screen TV wedged in a large cab pickup (left unattended for five hours at area mall). It's so important not to overload your trunk so you are forced to put property in your car cab. If you have no room in your trunk, lock smaller items in your glove box or center console so your property is out of sight.

Be aware of your surroundings and who is watching you. A perfect example is at clubs where bad guys know women do not like to take their purses in the club. The women will park their car, get out and put their purse in the trunk taking only a state driver's license and one credit card with them. It would be better to have already locked the purse in the car before arriving and parking. If you are moving property around to your trunk and you think someone is birddogging you, make sure the birddogger sees you looking at them. This will create insecurity on their part and they will less likely burglarize your vehicle.
